RECOMMENDATION

That Council accepts the quote from Blackwoods for the lump sum price of \$158,309.20 for the supply of guardrail and components for the repair of existing, unserviceable guardrail.

BACKGROUND

In conjunction with the Indian Ocean Territories Administration (IOTA), Shire staff identified the need to replace a significant amount of unserviceable guardrail around the Island.

As guardrail components are expensive to supply and ship, Shire staff sought financial support from IOTA to purchase the materials last financial year, with the intention to install the components on nominated sites, plus have some additional components for future maintenance.

The nominated sites are currently:

- Golf Course/Casino Road
- Road up to Taijin House
- Sections along Phosphate Hill Road and Linkwater Road

Additionally it has been recognised that the end treatments on most of the guardrail installations are non-compliant, so a program of replacement will start with this material order.

A Request for Quote (RFQ) was issued on 5 May 2023 and closed on 17 May 2023. The RFQ was a Schedule of Rates request so the final order could be scaled according to IOTA's budget.

Submissions were received from: Blackwoods; and Safety Barriers WA Whilst the unit rates provided by both Suppliers were comparable, the RFQ called for the products to be containerised and delivered to Zentner Shipping. Only Blackwoods complied with this request.

Negotiations then commenced with both IOTA and Blackwoods to refine the list of items and a price that met with IOTA's budget.

COMMENT

The Shire has been fortunate to secure funding from IOTA to purchase and ship a supply of guardrail and components last financial year. There are numerous current guardrail installations that are in disrepair and provide little to no protection to significant drop-offs. This purchase will go a long way to improving the safety and amenity of Shire roads.
